WHO WE ARE

The Taylorsville-Bennion Improvement District provides culinary water and wastewater services to Taylorsville and portions of Murray, West Jordan, Kearns, and West Valley. The District was created in 1957 as an independent water and sewer special district under the laws of Salt Lake County. The need for the District grew out of the necessity to provide life sustaining water and sewer disposal needs of an ever-increasing population. In a little over 160 years, the community has grown in number from a few families to over 70,000 people. Initially, there were less than 100 connections but today, there are over 17,000.

DROUGHT RESPONSE

Utah has been in drought eight of the last 10 years, and this year's dismal snowpack is not enough to end it. We do not know how long this drought will last. That is out of our control. But what is in our control is how we respond. All Utahns across all sectors need to use less water and look for ways to use this critical resource more efficiently.

TBID is closely monitoring drought conditions and has developed a Drought Contingency Plan that will be followed as restrictions become necessary (see plan at tbid.org). On May 18th, the TBID board approved a resolution stating that TBID is in Drought Response Level 1. Customers are strongly encouraged to voluntarily reduce water use as much as possible.




Watering Guidelines: It is requested that customers continue to follow the State of Utah Division of Water Resources lawn watering guide and look for other ways to reduce outdoor watering.



RATES AND PROPERTY TAXES

Rates: TBID has some of the lowest rates in the valley. TBID rates are approximately 24% lower than the average of neighboring water and wastewater utilities!

Property Taxes: TBID has not raised property taxes in over 20 years. TBID customers pay less than \$40 annually on a \$500,000 home.



To ensure that TBID rates are fair and reasonable, the District has rates analyzed every 5 years by an independent, third-party rate consultant. This assists the District to take care of both short-term and long-term needs. TBID will continue to utilize customers' fees and taxes as efficiently as possible as we diligently work to provide our customers with clean water and reliable wastewater services!
